Second Harvest

There are many faces of Hunger in San Jose & worldwide. Join the fight to end hunger.

Forty million people face hunger in the US today, including more than 12 million children, and five million seniors. One in eight people in the US struggle with hunger.

However, hunger isn't as far away from a problem as it may seem like. In California, 4,574,710 people are struggling with hunger, and 1,731,270 of them are children. One in four people are experiencing food insecurity. Nearly 27 percent of those living in Santa Clara and San Mateo counties are at risk for hunger—almost 720,000 people.

One of the organizations looking to decrease those statistics is Second Harvest Food Bank. Second Harvest is a nonprofit organization, that was founded 1974, and is one of the largest food banks in America. Its mission is to, "lead our community to ensure that anyone who needs a healthy meal can get one." They provide food to more than a quarter of a million people in Santa Clara and San Mateo counties every month.

Second Harvest has already provided 40,960,174 meals so far in 2018, and more than half the people they serve are kids and seniors.

The food we collect from our project, "End Hunger (Games)," will go to Second Harvest Food Bank and Convoy of Hope. Our End Hunger (Games) Exhibition is on December 18th and we're hoping that it makes a difference in the lives of people who need it.
