May is coming up, which means we will have our second spirit rally soon! It will be on the 20th of May and will be Storybook themed.


UPCOMING INFORMATION




LSI ELECTIVE HIGHLIGHTS!



8TH GRADE LSI PROJECTS




EXPLORATORY SCIENCE



- Know your own warning signs. Are you stressed or just tired? Talk to your friends about it!



Locus of Control

When it comes to who controls your life, there are two. basic,

opposing mindsets; two different Locuses of Control. The first one is an external Locus of Control (LOC). This means you feel like destiny or fate or some other, external force is deciding your life for you. The second is an internal LOC, where you feel like you control what comes out of your life. Let's say two people are playing a sport and their team

loses. A person with an external LOC will be able to brush it off as, "The sun was in my eyes," or "I wasn't feeling well today." However, a person with an internal LOC will feel more responsible, which can be a good or bad thing. For example: "I'm not good at sports," or "I forgot to practice; it was my fault."
